

# Department of Human Assistance Foster Care Office Closure FAQ

**Why is the Department of Human Assistance (DHA) closing 847 F Street office?** The lease for the 847 F Street office in West Sacramento expires on October 31, 2026. The decision not to renew the lease was made prior to the signing of House Resolution 1 (H.R. 1) and is based on a long-term lease expiration. This transition provides an opportunity to relocate services to Sacramento County locations (currently located in Yolo County) and continue serving customers from county-operated facilities.

**When will the office close?** Staff will begin relocating to other DHA locations in July 2026. The last day the lobby will be open to the public is Thursday, July 16, 2026. Building closure activities will occur between August and October 2026. **This location will close permanently on October 31, 2026.**

**How will this affect customers?** Customers will continue to have full access to services. Aid to Families with Dependent Children – Foster Care (AFDC-FC), Kinship Guardianship Assistance Payment (Kin-GAP), and Adoption Assistance services will continue at new DHA locations without interruption. Customers will be notified of any changes to their assigned office or worker contact information.

**Where can customers go for help instead?** Services will continue to be available by appointment only at the following DHA locations:

**Will impacted staff be laid off?** No, impacted staff assigned to this location will be relocated to other Sacramento County offices.

**Why is the 847 F Street location closing specifically?** The lease for the building is expiring. DHA determined this was an opportunity to relocate services to other locations while maintaining the same services for customers.

**What steps are being taken to ensure customers and the community are informed?** DHA will share information with customers, community partners, and stakeholders throughout the transition. Additionally, staff will communicate directly with affected customers and information will be posted in our internal and external websites.

**How will this decision benefit the community?** Relocating services to Sacramento County facilities allows DHA to continue providing services from county-operated locations while ensuring customers continue to receive the support they need.
